# **#OrangeUp Your City!**

Raise Awareness about kidney cancer in your community by requesting a local building or landmark to #OrangeUp and be illuminated orange in March. Orange is the national kidney cancer awareness color.

Ready to #OrangeUp your city? Here's how to find the right resources in your area and make an orange lighting request.

### STEP 1

Explore your city government website for ways to recognize an event or cause.

#### STEP 2

When in doubt, contact your Mayor's office, City Hall, or a department like "Special Events" and ask to be directed to the best person to learn about the available options.

# STEP 3

Once you've identified if any local structures are available for illumination, complete any forms or applications. The KCA encourages orange illuminations on the first Saturday in March, but any available date(s) in March will work!

# STEP 4

Let your community know what is being illuminated and why you're recognizing Kidney Cancer Awareness Month! Use social media and email to let everyone know how kidney cancer impacts you and how support can make a difference for others.

# STEP 5

Let the KCA know what you're doing, too. Email office@kidneycancer. org to let us know about confirmed illuminations. Share your photos on social media and tag the KCA and use the #OrangeUp and #KidneyCancerAwarenessMonth hashtags so we can see your support.
